TRIR FORMULA

To ensure fairness between competing nominations from worksites of different sizes and scales, an equalizer formula, called the **Total Recordable Incident Rating** (TRIR), is applied.

TRIR is calculated by multiplying the total number of recordable incidents by 200,000 (hours worked in a standard year multiplied by 100 full-time employees) divided by the total number of hours worked.

$\frac{\text{\# of Recordable Incidents} \times 200,000}{\text{Total \# of Hours Worked}}$

WHAT IS A RECORDABLE INCIDENT?

A work related injury, illness or incident that has one or more of the following criteria is to be considered a recordable incident:

- Death
- LTI, days away from work
- Restricted work (light duty) or transfer to another job
- Medical treatment beyond a first aid
- Loss of consciousness



Turnaround and outage events present a unique set of challenges for maintenance industry stakeholders.

The "TZIT" Award showcases the collaborative efforts of the tripartite in executing a major turnaround event without a recordable injury.
